Notification of the coronavirus (COVID-19) measures at the Kabukiza Theatre

Thank you for supporting the Kabukiza Theatre and our theatre productions. We will provide a safe environment inside our theatres by taking the following measures. We ask all visitors' understanding and cooperation regarding the precautionary measures below which will be implemented at our theatres.

Requests for Customer Cooperation



Wearing a mask is recommended.



Customers with tickets for consecutive parts are asked to leave the theatre once the previous part has ended so that the theatre can be cleaned and sanitized.



We ask customers to refrain from talking as much as possible when eating in their seats and in the lobby.

*No eating during performances





Please refrain from talking loudly during performances and in the lobby.



Please refrain from paying visits or giving gifts to cast members.

•We ask audience members to wear a mask when shouting/calling out toward the stage (Ö-mukō). Audience members without a mask, who call from places outside the designated area on the 3rd floor, and those

interrupting the stage performances may be asked to refrain from doing so.

Assigned members from the theatre will shout from the designated area on the 3rd floor with their masks on.

•We may refuse entry to customers who do not follow the theatre staff's instructions, or who cause any nuisance that unreasonably interferes with other customers.

Measures at the theatre



Hand sanitizers will be installed in theatre lobbies and restrooms.



Ventilation and Humidity is properly maintained inside the auditorium.



We are increasing the physical health checks for our theater staff. *All theatre staff will wear a mask and hand gloves.

•Tea will not be offered at the Box Seats.

•To avoid overcrowding, please leave from the nearest exit.
